Working Holiday/Youth Mobility Agreement

Nationals of the following countries, aged between 18-30 years, may apply for a Working Holiday / Youth Mobility Agreement Visa at the German Embassy in Vienna: Argentina, Australia, Canada, New Zealand, Japan, Chile, Israel and Uruguay. The maximum duration of the Visa is 12 months. The Working Holiday Visa can only be issued once. Canadian citizens may apply for a Youth Mobility Agreement Visa up to the age of 35 years.

To apply for a Working-Holiday / Youth Mobility Agreement Visa you must book an [appointment](#) and submit **all of the following documents**. **Please also provide certified translations of documents that are not in English or German**. The German Embassy reserves the right to ask for additional documents at any point during the application process. Incomplete applications cannot be accepted.

- Visa fee:** EUR 75,00 (payable in cash or with credit card)
- Expenses:** Postage and Packaging for Passport delivery within Austria: EUR 7,00 (payable in cash or with credit card)
- 1** completed and signed [application form for a national visa](#)
- A passport** with at least two blank pages valid for at least three months longer than the intended return date. Please provide copies of the data page and all pages containing visa stamps or entries.
- 1 passport size biometric photograph**, taken within the last 6 months
- Proof of sufficient financial means** (min. EUR 2.500,00, i.e. last 3 months of statements of your personal bank account (with translation if applicable) only bank statements in EUR can be accepted
- A return flight ticket to your home country or evidence of sufficient funds to purchase a return ticket** (EUR 1.500,00 in addition to the required funds stated above)
- Argentinian nationals:** [Police clearance certificate](#) from your home
- detailed CV and motivational letter**
- Travel health insurance**, providing cover of at least EUR 30.000,00 - for the whole duration of your planned stay in Germany
